

iPhone Users Guide: How to Stream a Phone Call Directly to Bluetooth-enabled Hearing Aids




Step 1: Turn on your hearing aids.



Make sure your hearing aids are switched on.

Step 2: Make sure Bluetooth is on and your hearing aids have been paired to the phone. If already paired go to step 7. If not already paired, follow steps 3 through 6.



Your iPhone should have Bluetooth® activated and your hearing aids need to be paired with it.



<p>Step 3: Go to Setting and then General</p>	<p>Step 4: Go to Accessibility</p>	<p>Step 5: Go to Hearing Devices</p>	<p>Step 6: Your hearing aids will appear, select pair when prompted</p>
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
Step 7: Once paired, you will hear your phone’s ringtone or message alerts directly through your hearing aids. To make or receive a call use the phone as you normally would.



Step 8: You do not need to hold the phone to your ears. Just hold it in front of your face so you can speak into it. The incoming voice will automatically route to both hearing aids.



Step 9: When you are finished with your phone call, hang up and streaming will automatically stop.
